

TERM I NEWSLETTER

Kia ora!

Welcome to all whānau of Ngā Wai. We do hope you have had an excellent summer.

We'd like to begin with mentioning how excited we are to welcome the Year 4 students into Ngā Wai. It is a very big shift for our team, but one which offers incredible possibilities for support and extension of our ākonga. It also offers us the opportunity to adapt and change to suit the needs of our learners.

After only a couple of days back at school, it is easy to see how well the Year 4s fit into our social fabric. Our team is especially lucky to have kaiako with many combined years of teaching in a Year 3/4 environment as well as Year 5/6.

The Aotearoa/New Zealand Curriculum Refresh, which is now into its third year, brackets its objectives and understandings into the Year groups of Year 4 to Year 6. Aligning our team with this as more curriculum areas come online, makes sense from a teaching and learning viewpoint.

As in any transformative process there are sidesteps, adjustments and challenges to face, and we welcome you to be part of this. Working together, we can make 2024 a year of adventure and learning for the students in our team.

Term One will be a foundation building term with teachers extending and beginning their relationships with the students. It is a term of identifying skills, strengths and needs, and shifting dispositions in core subject areas. We will be mixing the classes up at different times of the week, and this will increase as the year progresses.

Term One Learning / / /

As teachers develop understanding of their learners there will be oral language and instructional comprehension. Our oral language focus will be on storytelling and enriching vocabulary to add detail. George's Marvelous Medicine (see below) will be the start point for the instructional comprehension.

Early sessions of mathematics will involve "whole class" activities to provide teachers with an opportunity to assess levels of students. Following that the term long focus will be on addition and subtraction skills in whole and part numbers.

We are also reflecting back on our past and implementing a teacher led research inquiry into place and culture. This will take on a "project" model and may even include a title page! Something nearly all of us coveted in our youth.

Something we are carrying over from 2023 is our PROJECT X. When Year 4s are swimming, our Year 5 and 6s will pick up our local impact projects and bring them closer to fruition.

From Week 3 we will also resume our EQ sessions that run in conjunction with Te Reo and Robotics/Coding.

Bronagh Crook and Rowan Youngblood are our specialist release teachers this term. Bronagh will be taking three sessions with each class on the technical aspects of portraiture with pastels. Rowan is taking a scientific angle with our classes, building vocabulary and comprehension of scientific concepts.

Swimming / / / /

The Year 4s will be swimming this term, starting Wednesday 7 February at Wellington Regional Aquatic Centre. Students will leave by bus at 9:00am and arrive back at school at morning tea time. Sean Mead will accompany them. They will be joined by the Year 3 students and a teacher from the Junior School.

Please help your child to organise their swim gear (togs, towel, goggles, hair tie, in a waterproof bag) the night before.

Our Year 5 & 6s will begin swimming on Mondays in Term 2.

Learning at home////

In the coming weeks, each student will also have access to StudyLadder so they can complement their classroom mathematics with extra tasks at home. We hope that students take on a challenge by choice approach, knowing that the effort they put in has visible results across the year.

In Ng \bar{a} Wai we understand the need for children to have some down time, some time to explore their interests and take a break from the structure of school.

Stationery: Pencil Cases////

In Ngā Wai students are required to have their own pencil cases (we do not share stationery). There are a few students that still require help to get this organised.

Seesaw and Google accounts////

We operate on both the Seesaw and Google platforms. Seesaw provides a safe and secure way for tamariki to share mahi with home as well as other members of the class. In the coming weeks you will receive an invitation to your child's Seesaw page and class blog. The blog offers a selection of work from across the class. This blog is only available to those with the access code.

Seesaw will be our main way for communicating information relevant to our specific class groupings. Any formal and important teamwide communications will be sent via email and duplicated on Seesaw.

Students also have access to the Google Suite of learning tools including Gmail, Slides and Docs. This is such a powerful group of tools. We will cover the effective and appropriate use of these as Term One progresses. We consider our digital devices tools not toys and we are well protected by the Ministry's N4L network security. The Gmail accounts also have safety features built in to prevent unsolicited emails. Students new to the school will be allocated an account as soon as processing allows. Whānau are required to sign and return our ICT agreement before device use can begin.
