### **Areas of Focus**

- Literacy: We are thrilled to announce our partnership with the University of Canterbury- Better Start Literacy programme! designed specifically for classroom teachers, this programme aims to use literacy strategies that will have a positive ripple effect on your child's learning journey. The Better Start Literacy Approach is a structured approach to literacy instruction in the early years of schooling, to support children's early reading, writing and oral language success. It includes the systematic teaching of critical phonological awareness skills and letter sound knowledge skills through fun, games-based activities, activities making explicit links to the reading and spelling context, and structured small group reading sessions using the new Ready to Read - Phonics Plus early readers series. In addition, the approach includes explicit teaching in vocabulary skills and in building children's oral narrative and listening comprehension skills through quality children's story books. The Better Start Literacy Approach follows a structured phonics scope and sequence that is used in the class and small group reading teaching. Over the next few weeks your child will complete a series of assessments to ensure that we are able to target their learning. In the mean time, the children will bring home a choosing book or a shared reading book. A choosing book will be slightly lower than a levelled reader, this is so they are able to read it independently. These are also used to practise our fluency aiming to develop phrasing and attending to punctuation. A shared book is read with the whole class and with the support of the teacher. A parent information evening will be held at school near the end of February. Further information will follow in the up coming weeks.
- The Reading Journal encourages positive reading attitudes, parental involvement and promotes communication between home and school. We ask that you record the reader for the day and write a comment or draw a small picture about the book. Year 2 and Year 3 children are encouraged to do this themselves.
- Writing is an important part of the literacy programme as it helps support the development of their reading. The children will be writing daily with an emphasis on story telling. If you have any wonderful stories to tell feel free to share them with your child so they can draw on them when writing.
- **Te Reo Māori**: through the sharing of pūrākau (stories) the children are exposed to origin stories, customs and the language. The children will be given opportunities to practise greetings and basic sentences in te reo Māori.
- Fridays: Each Friday the children will come together and have the opportunity to work in tuakana/teina groups. The mixed-age groupings provide a unique opportunity for peer learning and mentoring. Younger students benefit from the guidance and support of older peers, while older students reinforce their knowledge by sharing it with younger learners. This collaborative approach fosters a sense of responsibility, empathy, and camaraderie among our children, creating a vibrant and inclusive learning team. These workshops will cover Science, Hand-Eye and Aotearoa Nz Histories.
- Science: In science this term we will be exploring the world of plants. Designed to spark curiosity and love of learning, these workshops will introduce the students to the wonders of botany. From exploring the life cycles or plants to understanding how they grow and adapt.
- Hand-Eye: Unlocking the power of precision through a range of differentiated activities that foster the development of coordination, fine motor skills, and dexterity. We aim to cultivate not just skills but a sense of accomplishment, promoting confidence and independence.
- Aotearoa NZ Histories: We are taking a journey through Aotearoa's histories in collaboration with Kura Ahurea. This unique partnership brings together the expertise of mana whenua, Te Ātiawa ki Te Whanganui a Tara/Taranaki Whānui . Students will delve into the stories, fostering an understanding and appreciation for our shared history.

### **Areas of Focus**

**Numeracy:** Through hands-on activities, group discussions, and problem-solving challenges, students will apply their mathematical skills to explore number through story. They will analyse data, solve equations, and engage in critical thinking as they unravel mathematical concepts.

Kura Ahurea: We are excited to be partnering with Kura Ahurea. Kura Ahurea introduces a Te Ātiawa ki Te Whanganui a Tara/Taranaki Whānui (mana whenua/Local iwi) perspective on local history, tikanga, and kawa. Integrating Te Reo Māori, local historical narratives, and hands-on support from local iwi.

Rowan and Bronagh will cover teachers classroom release time (CRT) across the school. When the children are working with them they will cover the below areas.

### Visual Arts: With Bronagh Crook

Kia ora, this year I have the privilege of providing an art programme across all class levels. I will be providing opportunities for the students to explore and discuss a range of artists' works, with the prospect of developing skills that will enable them to express their ideas through a range of mediums, incorporating a range of styles.

This term we will be focusing on creating self-portraits using a range of skills and processes. In Papatūānuku, the children will be encouraged to explore drawing and creating shapes from different perspectives to help in their composition of a self-portrait. Over the course of the term they will produce a number of portraits using different mediums e.g. crayon/dye, pastels, paint.

### **Road Safety**

When picking up or dropping off your children
