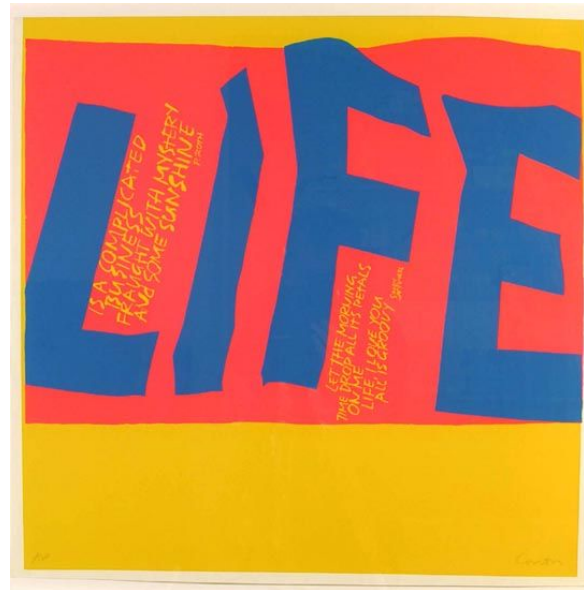
THE LIFE OF CORITA KENT

Sister Corita was an American Catholic nun who lived in Los Angeles but was born in Fort Dodge Iowa 1918 on the 20th of November. Sister Corita's artwork was mostly done by silkscreen printing or serigraphy. The message Sister Corita wanted to put with her artwork was love and peace. Sadly in the 1970s Sister Corita

was diagnosed with cancer. In 1986 Sister Corita died at quite an early age of 67 years old.
